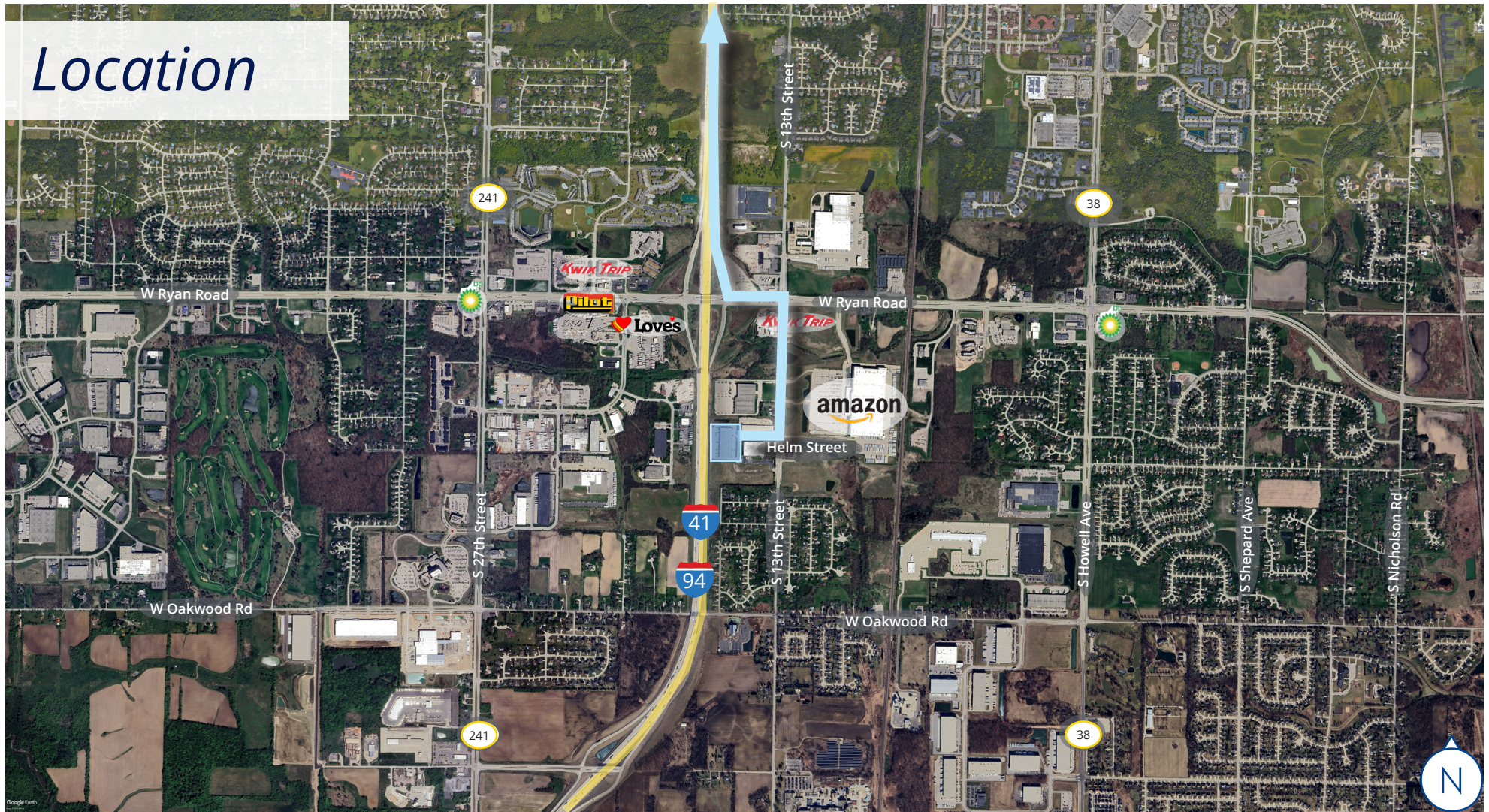

Broker Disclosure to Customers

- The duty to provide you with accurate information about market conditions with a reasonable time if you request it, unless disclosure of the information is prohibited by law.
- The duty to disclose to you in writing certain Material Adverse Facts about a property, unless disclosure of the information is prohibited by law.
- The duty to protect your confidentiality. Unless the law requires it, the Firm and its Agents will not disclose your confidential information or the confidential information to other parties.
- The duty to safeguard trust funds and other property held by the Firm or its Agents.
- The duty, when negotiating, to present contract proposals in an objective and unbiased manner and disclose the advantages and disadvantages of the proposals.

This disclosure is required by section 452.135 of the Wisconsin statutes and is for information only. Confidentiality Notice to Customers

The Firm and its Agents will keep confidential any information given to the Firm and its Agents in confidence, or any information obtained by the Firm and its Agents that a reasonable person would want to be kept confidential, unless the information must be disclosed by law or you authorize the Firm to disclose particular information. Definition of Material Adverse Facts

A "Material Adverse Fact" is defined in Wis. Stat. 452.01 (5g) as an Adverse Fact that a party indicates is of such significance, or that is generally recognized by a competent licensee as being of such significance to a reasonable party, that it affects or would affect the party's decision to enter into a contract or agreement concerning a transaction or affects or would affect the party's decision about the terms of such a contract or agreement.

An "Adverse" fact is defined in Wis. Stat. 452.01 (1e) as a condition or occurrence that a competent licensee generally recognizes will significantly and adversely affect the value of the property, significantly reduce the structural integrity of improvements to real estate, or present a significant health risk to occupants of the property; or information that indicates that a party to a transaction is not able to or does not intend to meet his or her obligations under a contract or agreement made concerning the transaction.
