Description

The property forms part of a parade of retail units on Queen Street, the main shopping area in Morley. Internally the unit comprises a ground floor sales area, with a storage area to the rear and staff area on the first floor which includes kitchen and w/c facilities. The property benefits from a glazed frontage and retractable canopy.

Location

The property occupies a prime location fronting the pedestrianised Queen Street in the heart of Morley's prime retail core. The premises are adjacent to Card Factory and RSPCA Leeds & Wakefield. Nearby occupiers include Savers, Well Pharmacy, Hays Travel & Morley Indoor Market, with several public car parks within the vicinity of the premises.

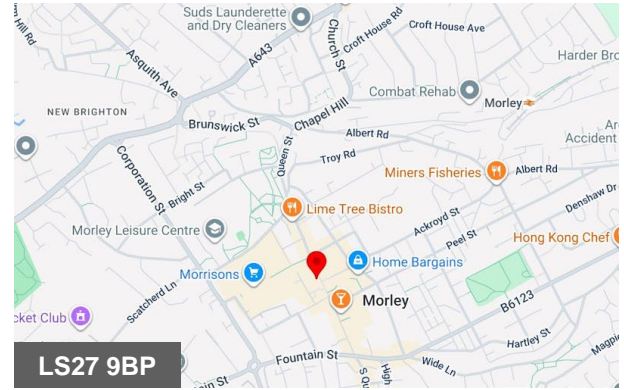

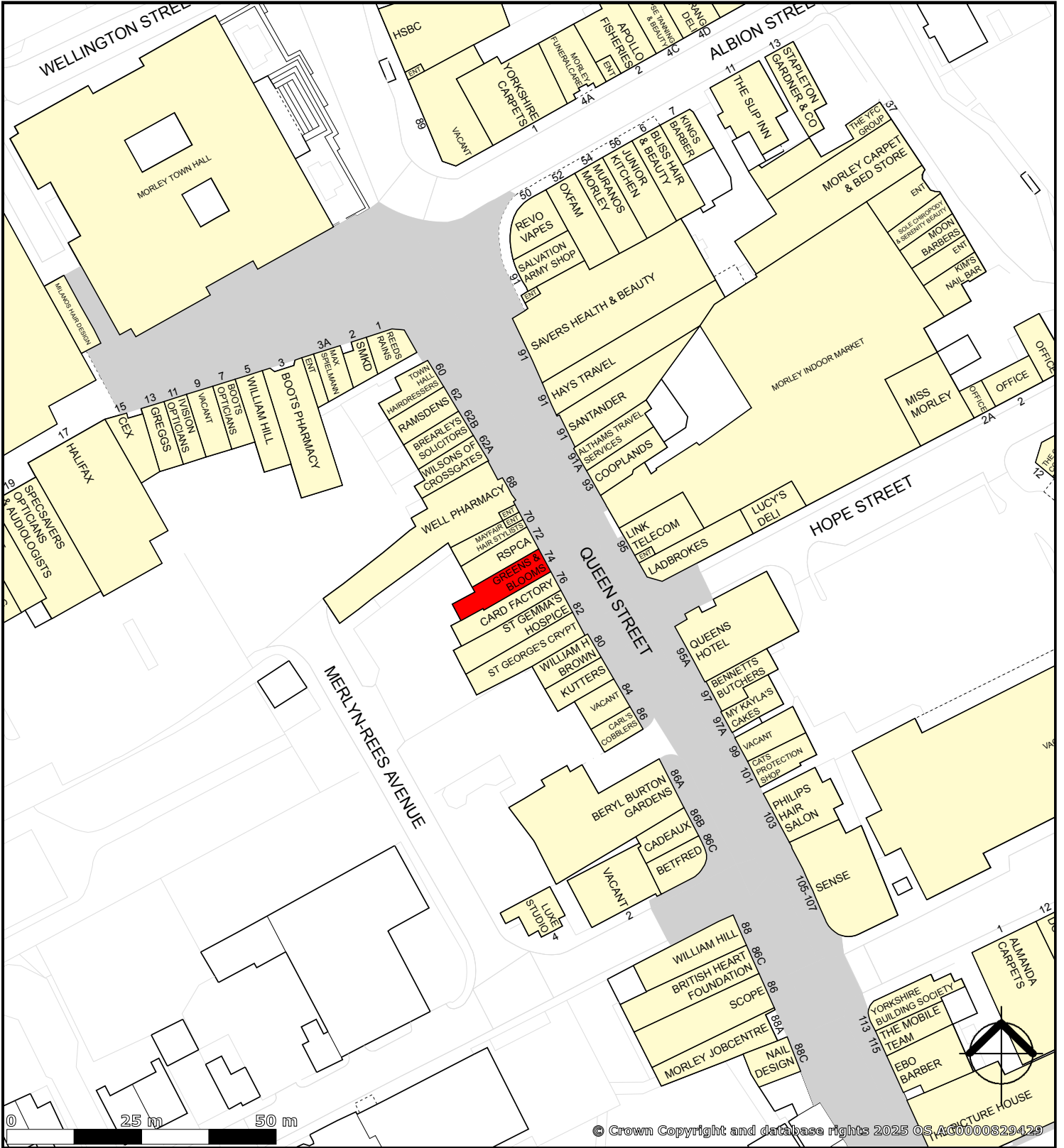
