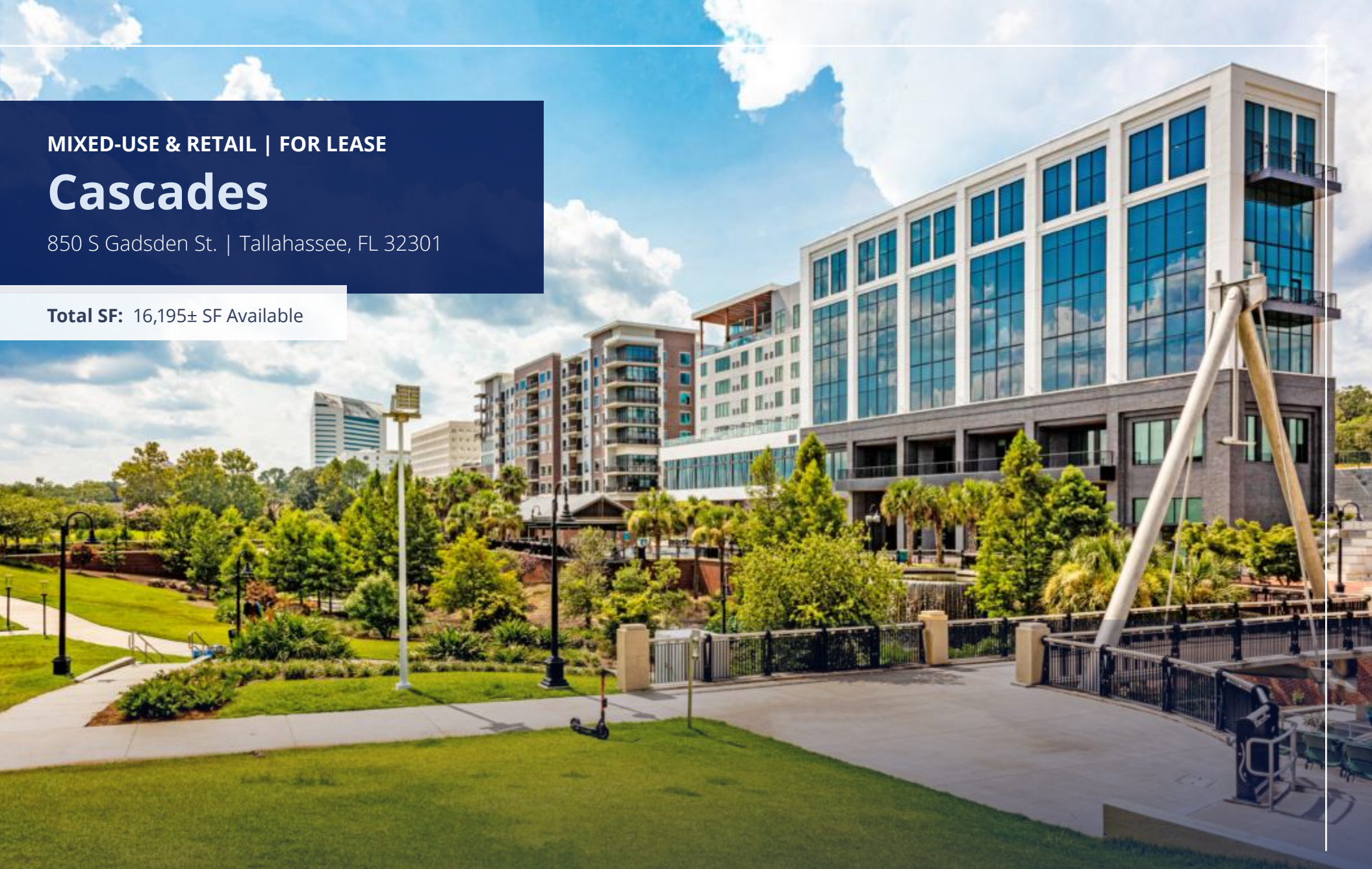

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Property Overview

The Cascades Project, Tallahassee's most significant economic development initiative, is transforming a two-block area on East Gaines Street, directly across from the 24-acre Cascades Park.

This dynamic development is generating over \$350 million in economic impact and creating nearly 700 permanent jobs. It celebrates Tallahassee's rich history by preserving the architecturally notable former County Health Unit, restoring the Old City Waterworks building and creating a community-designed historical plaza.

The project features a mix of market-rate mid-rise residential units, retail spaces, office facilities, restaurants and a hotel, all designed to enhance views of both the park and the Capitol building. The development includes pedestrian-friendly pathways connecting to downtown, family-friendly amenities, event spaces to support performances at The Adderly Amphitheater and expanded public parking.

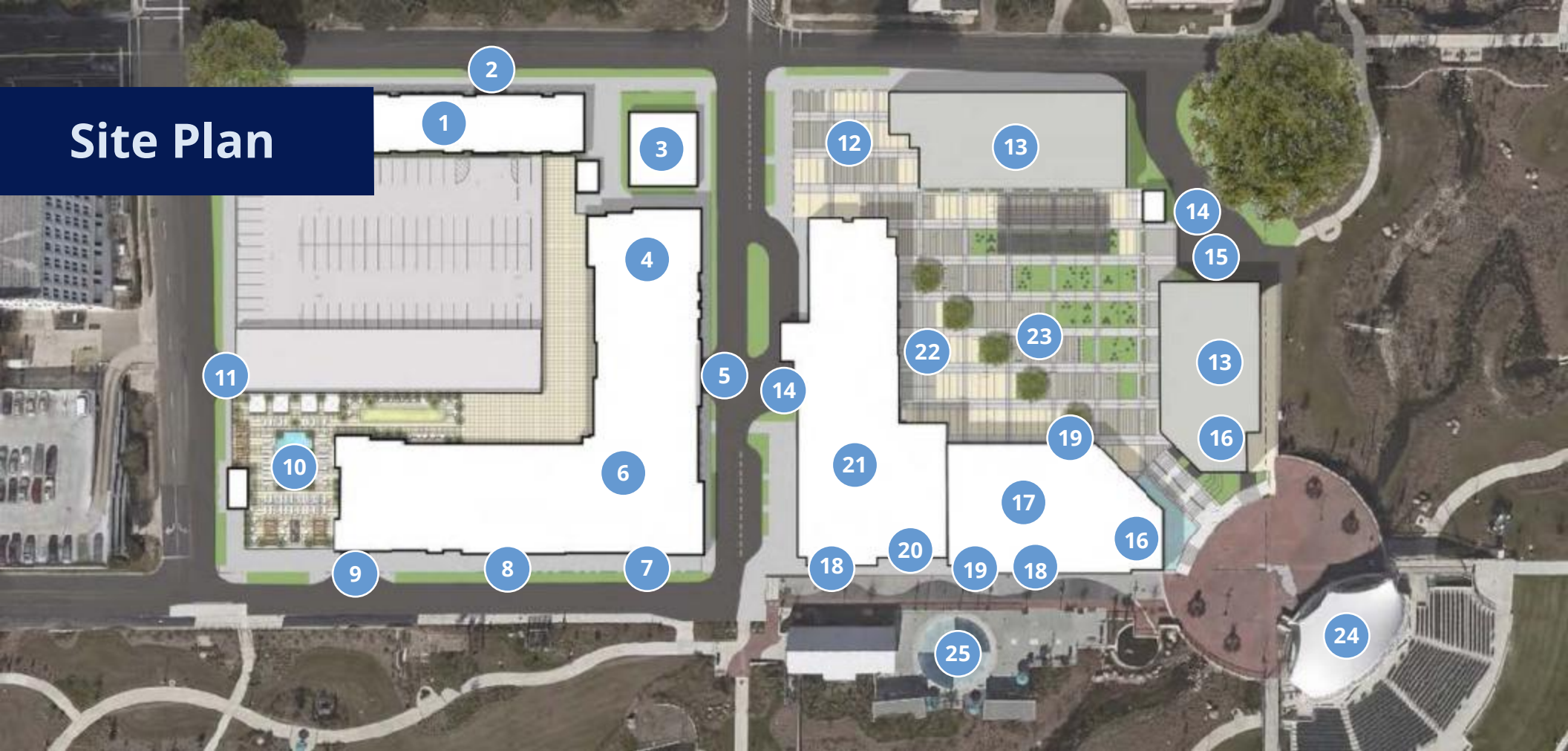

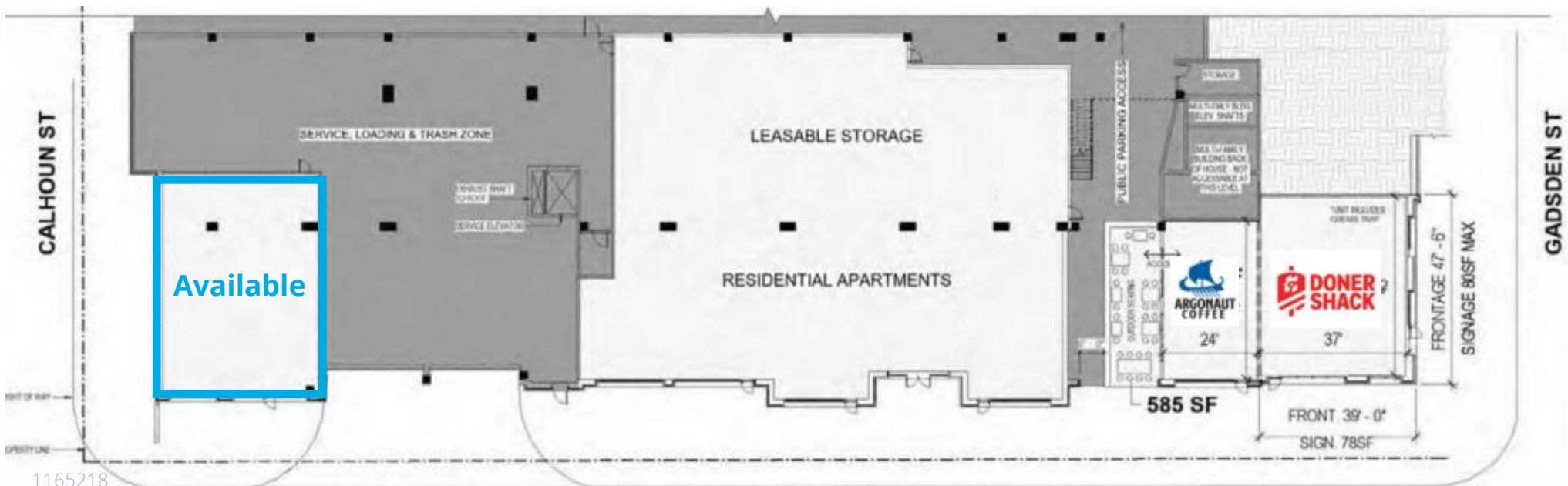

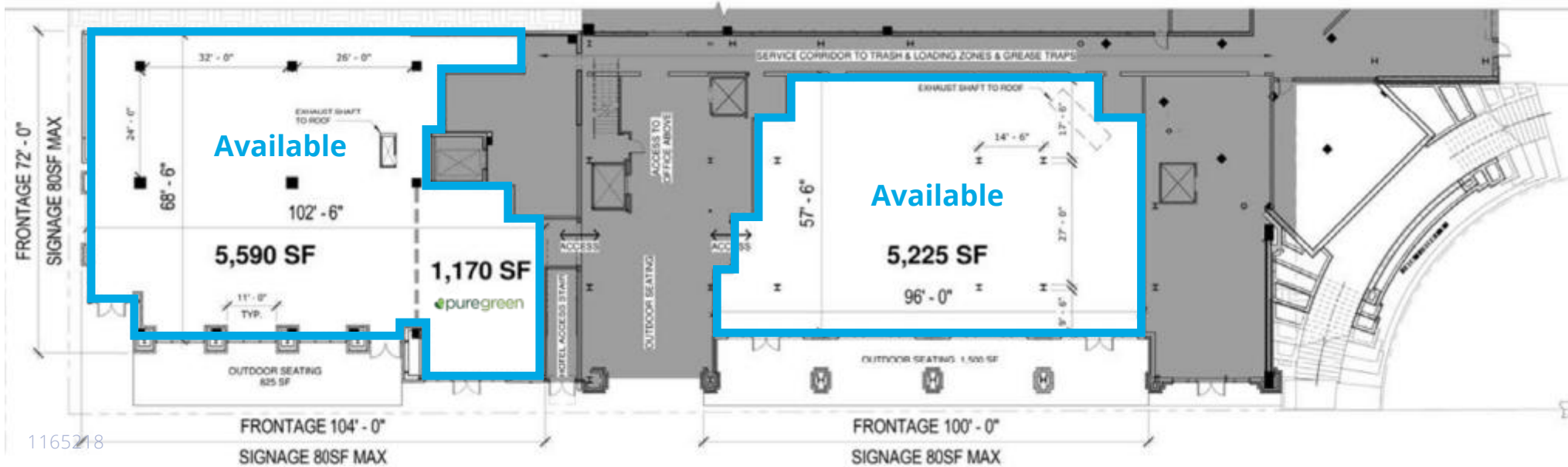

Meridian Marker: The Meridian Marker in Tallahassee, Florida, marks the initial point for all land surveys in the state, established in 1824. It is located in Cascades Park and serves as a historical landmark, commemorating the beginning of Florida's land survey system.

The Adderley Amphitheater, located in Cascades Park, Tallahassee, is a stunning outdoor venue with a seating capacity of 3,500. It serves as the centerpiece of the park, offering a beautiful setting for concerts and events. The amphitheater is designed to take advantage of Tallahassee's idyllic weather, making it a popular spot for both artists and music lovers.

CASCADE PARK

Covering 24 acres, Cascades Park hosts over 60 events each year, including walks, 5K races, movie nights, concerts, literary events, and awareness activities.

HISTORY

Cascades Park is an ideal destination to explore Tallahassee's rich history. From the city's founding at the Prime Meridian Plaza to the Smokey Hollow Commemoration that reflects life in the 1900s, this park offers a glimpse into the past. Along its trails, you can discover the story of Tallahassee from its early days through the 1900s, combining exercise with education.

PRIME MERIDIAN MARKER

The Florida Korean War Memorial is both striking and poignant. Situated in a serene area, a walkway leads visitors to a plaza centered around a vertical circle of red marble inscribed with the words "Duty, Honor, Country." This circle symbolizes the purity of the Circle of Life, though its top is broken, with the missing piece nearby inscribed with the word "Life." This fragment bears the names of 538 Floridians who lost their lives during the war. Within the circle stands a simple tribute: a pair of boots resting on a rifle, with an empty helmet atop. Surrounding this tribute are rough-cut marble pieces etched with the names of key battles, while the plaza floor features a map of the Korean Peninsula and a timeline of significant events.

PRIME MERIDIAN MARKER

At the heart of the park stands the Prime Meridian Marker, a significant landmark for all Floridians. Established in 1824, this marker serves as the starting point for all land surveys in Florida and marks the original southeast corner of Tallahassee's first boundary. Today, it is elegantly featured within a map of Florida, crafted with colorful bricks and durable granite.
